Share the Fun/ Dress Revue/ Impressive Dress Contest

November 4, 2006 — Balko School

The Beaver County 4-H Share-the-Fun competition will be held on November 4th at 9:30am with pre-registration due November 2 into the Beaver County Extension Office. All entries must be signed in by 9:00 am and will present their acts in the order in which they sign in. Each act will have a total of 10 minutes from start to finish with a maximum of 6 minutes for the presentation.

1st through 3rd places, Champion and Reserve Champion in Individuals, Small Groups (2-4) and Large Groups (5 or more) will be awarded. Champions in each division earn the privilege of representing Beaver County in the District Share-the-Fun Competition.

Dress Revue garments/items must be in the Extension Office by 5:00 p.m. on Nov. 2nd for judging purposes. Contestants must follow the guidelines in the 2006 Fairbook. Garments/Items must have been completed after January 1, 2006.

- There will be two categories (garments to be modeled and items not to be modeled) for each of the three divisions (Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced).
- Only *one garment can be entered* under the GARMENTS TO BE MODELED Category and must have attached narrative when entered. For Narrative Sheet contact your leader or the Extension Office.
- 1st-3rd places in each category in each division will be given, with a Champion and Reserve Champion in each of the three divisions.
- Contestant can *enter all classes* in ITEMS NOT TO BE MODELED.
- County officers will need to help with organization of participants and narration, etc of style show.

BEGINNING LEVEL (9-11 as of January 1, 2007)

Garments to be modeled:

1. Chef or Work Apron
2. Skirt w/elastic waist
3. Shorts w/elastic waist
4. Simple Two-piece Active Sportswear (no collars, no set-in sleeves)

Items not to be modeled:

1. Pillow Case (Pattern Provided)
2. Laundry Bag (Pattern Provided)
3. Tote Bag (Pattern Provided)
4. Simple Curtains
5. Item or Simple Garment Made of Polar Fleece
6. Fun Item - Decorated Shirt (#28 Fairbook)
7. Fun Item - Pot holder or hot mat

INTERMEDIATE LEVEL (Ages 12-14 as of Jan 1, 2007)

Garments to be modeled:

1. Bath Robe
2. Pull-on Top & Coordinating Bottoms w/elastic waist (shorts, pants or skirt)
3. Shorts, Pants, Skirt or Culottes w/waistband
4. One-piece garment (#16 Fairbook)
5. Two-piece Garment (Attach a 3"x5" card) (#17 Fairbook)

Items not to be modeled:

1. Blanket w/binding
2. Item Made of Polar Fleece
3. Non-Clothing Item (Attach a 3"x5" card) (#18 Fairbook)
4. Recycled Garment (Before & After Pictures)
5. Decorated Garment (Attach a 3"x5" card) (#32 Fairbook)
6. Sewn item related to another project (Attach a 3"x5" card) (#33 Fairbook)

ADVANCED LEVEL (Ages 15 & up as of Jan 1, 2007)

Garments to be modeled

1. Two-piece ensemble (Attach a 3"x5" card) (#21 Fairbook)
2. Lined skirt, pants or jacket
3. Unlined garment (Attach a 3"x5" card) (#23 Fairbook)
4. Coat, lined or unlined
5. Lined suit or dress
6. Special occasion garment (#26 Fairbook)
7. Garment constructed from another textile product such as a blanket, towel, sheet.

Items not to be modeled:

1. Item Made of Polar Fleece
2. Two pieces of travel accessories (#35 Fairbook)
3. Recycled Item (Attach before picture & cost sheet)
4. Embellished garment

4-H SPEECH CONTEST

Wednesday, November 15, 2006

The Beaver County 4-H Speech Contest will be held at the Beaver County Extension office on Wednesday, November 15, 2006. Pre-entries for the speech contest are due by November 17, 2005 at 5:00pm. All contestants must be at the Beaver County Extension office by 5:30 pm on November 15, 2006 to register. There will **not** be a video category this year. The 2006-2007 Beaver County 4-H Officers will need to be at the Beaver County Extension Office at 5:30 pm to help with registration and other activities.

Speech Contest Rules & Guidelines:

- The Speech Contest divisions are: Ag, General, Home Ec, Power Point Presentation, and Impromptu.
- First Year and Junior Speeches must be 3-5 minutes in length, and Seniors (14 Years of age as of January 1, 2007) must be 5-7 minutes in length. Talks may be either a regular speech or an illustrated talk with posters or some other visual aid to make the presentation more effective. All speeches using Power Point Presentation must enter under the Power Point Presentation category.
- Judges will be instructed to place more emphasis on student's knowledge of the speech. Learn your speech well enough to give it without notes.
- First year speeches will be judged separately and have their own Champion and Reserve in each division.
- Contestants must give a speech in one of the four categories (Ag, General, Power Point Presentation, or Home Ec) to be eligible to give an Impromptu Speech.
- Everyone giving a speech must be at the Beaver County Extension Office by 5:30 pm ready to give their speech.

Impressive Dress Contest

Impressive Dress Contest will directly follow Dress Revue on November 4, 2006 at Balko Schools. There will be two divisions: Juniors (9-13 years old as of January 1, 2007) & Seniors (14 years of age as of January 1, 2007). Each division will have the following classes:

Casual Wear-Garments to wear to school, fairs, rodeos, dates, spectator sports, shopping etc.

Active Sportswear-For Playing tennis, skiing, jogging, rodeo contests, etc.

Dress Wear-For church, attending weddings, special dates, etc.

Formal Wear- Garments for prom, ect.

Impressive Dress is for 4-H'ers to learn to select fashionable garments suitable for specific occasions. Outfits should meet the guidelines of the classes: Casual Wear, Active Sportswear, Dress Wear & Formal Wear. Garments may be purchased or sewn. Participants will be expected to model and give a short oral presentation (about 1 minute long) on their outfit.

Participants will be judged on how well the outfit looks and fits on participants, and on the participant's oral presentation as they describe the following: Who they are; Things they do in their outfit; How the outfit fits into their wardrobe; How the outfit makes them feel; Characteristics & care of fabric of outfit; and Why they like this outfit.
