Black Mesa Range Ecology Academy June 25 - 30, 2006 Society for Range Management Program

Have you always been interested in conservation, biology, plants, wildlife, livestock, outdoors, land improvement - but had nowhere to go to learn but the classroom? You should come to the Black Mesa Range Ecology Academy. This Academy is a weeklong experience where you will learn: Basic ecological principles

Plant identification

Leadership skills

Speaking skills

Teambuilding skills

How to evaluate habitat for wildlife and livestock

How to develop a land management plan

How to incorporate technology such as Global Positioning Satellites and Geographic Information Systems into land management

Eligibility and Location The Academy will feature 10 high school sophomores, juniors, and seniors from each state of Colorado, Kansas, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas and will be based out of Kenton, Oklahoma. This is beautiful country and features terrain and vegetation from the Rocky Mountains and the High Plains. Tours of local ranches, dinosaur tracks, hikes to Black Mesa, and locally prepared food are some of the features. - just a little talking, quite a bit of doing.

Applications must be postmarked by June 12.

Application Form, One letter of reference, One page essay, \$100 Deposit (\$100 balance due upon arrival at camp)

Oklahoma Youth Forestry and Wildlife Camp!!

Oklahoma's Youth Forestry and Wildlife Camp is a week-long adventure where students will learn about and gain an appreciation for the natural world. The 2006 Camp is June 5-10 and will be offered at Group Camp 2 in Beavers Bend State Park, located in the heart of the Kiamichi Mountains north of Broken Bow.

Activities:

While enjoying the out-of-doors, campers will explore natural resources and the issues affecting these resources through a series of hands-on programs led by resource professionals. These programs include wildlife management, forest management, stream ecology, fire management, urban forestry and multiple resource management.

Campers:

The co-ed youth camp is open to 11-14 year olds* who have an interest in Oklahoma and its natural environment. To apply to be a counselor you must be 16-19 years old.

Registration and Application:

Registration for the 5 night camp is \$175**and includes all meals, transportation at camp, field trips, and workshops with professional instructors, organized recreational activities, and non-personal supplies necessary for camp activities.

All campers must complete an application process. Only 65 students in Oklahoma will be accepted to forestry camp. For application materials please contact the Beaver County OSU Extension Office by **April 6** at 580-625-3464.
